






WE'RE BACK BUT WE NEED YOU!

This girl sure knows how to live life on the edge, with a crazy schedule that'll make your head spin.


Here's a sneak peek of some of the incredible things she's accomplished:


- Became the guardian angel of safety during the Oban Raft Race, even though she dozed off from all the adrenaline pumping.
